International negotiation is an essential activity for many managers. This PDW will help management teachers enrich their coverage of international negotiation. It is intended for all instructors who have taught or are interested in teaching international negotiation as a stand-alone course or as part of another course. The negotiation modules may be used to teach a variety of courses and subjects.

Designed to be highly interactive and to address specifics of particular teaching methods, as well as general pedagogical concerns, the PDW will consist of two main sessions: one centering on case discussion, and the other on simulations and role-plays. New materials, including the East-West case and the North-South simulation will be featured in this PDW. The PDW will discuss ways to handle in-class challenges and stimulate information exchange and innovation among participants.

The presenters of this PDW have over 25 years of experience teaching international negotiation, and all participants will have the opportunity to interact with them individually in small-group settings and jointly in team-taught plenary forums. Open to experienced and new teachers alike, the PDW will concentrate on ways to improve the effectiveness of teaching international negotiation.
